KNOLLWOOD RESIDENT HONORED IN PA HOMETOWN

Mansfield, Pennsylvania recently honored Knollwood resident Gene Dewey, proclaiming October 16, 2021 as "Arthur (Gene) Dewey Day". That day, Gene's West Point alma mater Sprint football team played his hometown Mansfield University's varsity team - the Mansfield "Mountaineers". The two teams named Gene their honorary co-captain and called on him to do the coin toss. Dewey established his neutral credentials with both home-town and alma mater team with a robust "Beat Navy" as he tossed the coin. On a wet day in the "Endless Mountains" of northern Pennsylvania, West Point won a well-fought game by a score of 19 to 11.

The idea for this recognition originated with Gene's long-time deer hunting buddy and Mansfield University Football Hall of Fame legend, Rod Pursell - who launched the program in concert with local community leaders. Mansfield Mayor Kathy Barrett started the day at the Mansfield History Center with the reading of the proclamation of "Arthur Gene Dewey Day". In response, Gene cited how well Mansfield's teachers and schools, including his eight elementary school years in a one-room schoolhouse ten miles in the deep countryside outside of Mansfield, had prepared him for future academic success at West Point, followed by a graduate degree from Princeton University. Gene pointed to the contributions of northern Pennsylvania's rugged outdoor life, together with character-building grounded in family and spiritual values, as strong supporting factors for his success in 43 years of military and civilian public service. Dewey's postings included three Pentagon assignments; two combat aviation tours in Vietnam; diplomatic service at the State Department; and problem-solving in major humanitarian crises while serving as United Nations Deputy High Commissioner for Refugees in Geneva, Switzerland. Gene's transformational career experience was his selection as a White House Fellow in 1968. His Fellowship work responsibilities for professionalizing the humanitarian night airlift into Biafra saved the lives of countless civilian victims of the Nigerian Civil War during 1968-70. President Nixon later named Dewey director of the White House Fellows Program - the Nation's senior leadership development initiative. Congratulations Secretary Dewey for this distinct honor. We are proud to have you as part of the Knollwood family!



TRAVELING AROUND TOWN!

In October, Knollwood visited the Audubon Naturalist Society in Chevy Chase, Maryland, for the grand opening celebration of Woodend Nature Sanctuary as a restored oasis of sustainable habitats.



Residents received a private tour on the new accessible trails and participated in a fun scavenger hunt. There was much to learn about and see on the mile walk through the forest sanctuary such as butterfly-friendly meadow habitats, a frog pond with lots of tadpoles, more than 350 native trees, 800 native shrubs and nearly 10,000 native plants.

PRIVATE TOUR OF THE PRESIDENT WOODROW WILSON HOUSE

The Woodrow Wilson House is a national historic landmark and house museum. During another exciting October trip, residents had one-hour private tour of the museum and the historic site, visiting the ground floor, the main floor and the private bedrooms of President Wilson and his wife Edith Wilson. All gained a greater awareness of Wilson's public life and ideals for future generations while openly and directly discussing Wilson's challenges, shortcomings and consequential decisions and leadership. The house is a time capsule from the 1920s and they got to see what life was like in this perfectly preserved post-presidential residence.
